Sharon Ann (Hunter) Ledbetter was a Denver native, born at St. Joseph's Hospital on September 10, 1950, to Edward and Adeline Hunter.

Sharon graduated with honors from both Lincoln High School in Denver and the University of Colorado-Boulder. As a business executive she served as Director of Logistics for COBE Laboratories in Lakewood at her retirement.

Sharon had no children of her own but considered it a "bonus" to be a grandmother to Hannah, Hunter, McCrae, and Marin Ledbetter. Despite her business accolades she considered this role her greatest achievement. She loved playing with them, teaching them, watching movies with them while eating popcorn and Dots, decorating cookies at Easter and Christmas, and introducing the wonders of travel, learning, and the theater. Upon reaching each one's thirteenth birthday she took particular pride in arranging a trip to New York City with each grandchild. Due to Sharon's decline in mobility, she made an exception for Marin, allowing her trip after the twelfth birthday.


Sharon loved traveling with Charlie. They visited the world covering four continents and twenty-four countries. She loved Italy and France, especially the cities of Florence, Venice, Paris, the Monet gardens of Giverny and the vineyards of Tuscany.

She is survived by her loving husband, Charles C. "Charlie" Ledbetter, two sisters, Sandra Pearce (Keith) of Littleton, Sally Davis (A.J.) of Tucson, AZ, grandchildren Hannah and Hunter Ledbetter of Highlands Ranch, (Andy Ledbetter & Lisa Ledbetter) and McCrae and Marin Ledbetter of Golden (Mike & Dana Ledbetter), and several nieces and nephews whom she adored. She was preceded in death by her parents and a sister Sue Vitasovic (Bruno).

Sharon loved the faith family of Hope UMC, remarking to Charlie that "everyone is so friendly, and really cares about you." Her last attendance at Hope came August 28 when her granddaughters sang. Despite her declining health and urges to stay home and watch the livestream, she was determined to be present.
